Residence Life - An Overview



Being part of the CPYB residence life community provides an invaluable complement to your training experience, providing opportunity to build life-long friendships with peers from across the nation and around the world!

Students who choose to live in the residential housing at Dickinson College must be prepared, and mature enough, to spend free time alone, as well as abide by all safety procedures and protocols.*

We ask that students and families give careful consideration to the following information. Additional communications and specifics will be forthcoming to those who confirm housing.

Residence Halls are located on the Dickinson College campus and are air-conditioned. Each room is equipped with a bed, a dresser, a desk with a chair, a bookcase, and closet. Community bathrooms are located on each floor. Common areas and bathrooms will be cleaned frequently by Dickinson College staff. Laundry facilities are available in the halls, operated by a mobile phone app, and microfridges can be rented through the College (additional fees will apply). Wi-Fi is available.

Each residence hall is staffed by the Residence Life Team who lives on-site throughout the five-week program and is trained to provide a positive and safe living-learning community. Every member of the team is CPR certified.

Students are assigned residence halls/floors/rooms according to age and gender. Males and females will not be housed in the same building.

Students are assigned two per room. Roommate assignments will be made by the Residence Life Team based on a questionnaire completed by each student. Specific roommate requests must be mutual and requested in advance through the required form.

Dining Services provides residential students with three meals prepared by the Dickinson College Dining Hall with fare including vegetarian, vegan, gluten-free and kosher options. Students with severe food allergies or reactions should plan accordingly for dining in a large, public environment, and CPYB can put students and families in touch with Dining Services to discuss their options and accommodations.

Health and Wellness services are available for residential students through the on-campus nurse and school psychologist consultants. All students are required to have had a physical within the last 12 months and submit a Physician Evaluation Form signed by a licensed physician prior to the program. CPYB also works with local urgent care and emergency rooms for students in need of additional medical attention.

Activities will be planned throughout the program by the Residence Life Team, and our trip to <u>Hersheypark</u> is a highlight each summer!

Walkable Program CPYB classes are held in our Warehouse Studios, located on the campus of Dickinson College. Residential students will walk to and from class, without ever leaving campus. Students are required to walk in groups of two or more.

*CPYB will continue to operate with rigorous health and safety guidelines in place, our plans and protocols will continue to evolve and are dependent upon the progress of the pandemic and updates to public health regulations and policies. All programs are subject to change. COVID-19 vaccines are encouraged but not required for those who are age-eligible.
