Then comes the Waltz of the Flowers, with a shimmering Dewdrop Fairy dancing among the lovely blooms, and finally, the Sugarplum Fairy returns with her Cavalier to perform a majestic dance.

It's time for Marie and the Prince to say goodbye to their friends and sail off together to lands unknown.

# Who's Who



#### **PETER ILYICH TCHAIKOVSKY** (Composer)

Peter Ilyich Tchaikovsky is considered the great Russian composer of the Romantic era, and his contributions to ballet are without equal. He was born on May 7, 1840 in Kamsko-Votkinsk, Russia. While he was a gifted piano student as a boy, he did not begin to study music seriously until the age of 21. In 1866, Tchaikovsky moved to Moscow, where he accepted a teaching position in a new conservatory and composed his First Symphony (1868), which was warmly received. In the 1870s, despite setbacks in his personal life, Tchaikovsky composed some of his greatest works: the ballet Swan Lake, the opera Eugene Onegin, the Violin Concerto, and the Fourth

Symphony. His fame grew with the success of such works as the Fifth Symphony (1888), the opera The Queen of Spades (1890), and The Sleeping Beauty (1890). He toured extensively, and in 1891 (the same year he composed The Nutcracker), he conducted at the opening night of Carnegie Hall in New York. On November 6, 1893 Tchaikovsky died, in St. Petersburg, only nine days after conducting the premiere of his Symphony No. 6 (Pathétique). Eight thousand mourners attended his funeral.



#### **GEORGE BALANCHINE** (Choreographer)

George Balanchine transformed the world of ballet. He is widelyr egarded as the most influential choreographer of the 20th century, and he co-founded two of ballet's most important institutions: New York City Ballet and the School of American Ballet.

Balanchine was born in St. Petersburg, Russia, in 1904, studied at the Imperial Ballet School in St. Petersburg, and danced with the Maryinsky Theatre Ballet Company, where he began choreographing short works. In the summer of 1924, Balanchine left the newly formed Soviet Union for Europe, where he

was invited by impresario Serge Diaghilev to join the Ballets Russes. For that company, Balanchine choreographed his first important ballets: Apollo (1928) and Prodigal Son (1929). After Ballets Russes was dissolved following Diaghilev's death in 1929, Balanchine spent his next few years on a variety of projects in Europe and then formed his own company, Les Ballets 1933, in Paris. Following a performance of Les Ballets 1933 at the Savoy Theater in London, he met American arts connoisseur Lincoln Kirstein, who later persuaded him to come to the United States. In 1934, the pair founded the School of American Ballet, which remains in operation to this day, training students for companies around the world. Balanchine's first ballet in the U.S., Serenade, set to music by Tschaikovsky, was created for SAB students and premiered on June 9, 1934, on the grounds of the Warbug estate in White Plains. Balanchine and Kirstein founded several short-lived ballet companies before forming Ballet Society in 1946, which was renamed New York City Ballet in 1948. Balanchine served as the Company's ballet master from that year until his death in 1983, building it into one of the most important performing arts institutions in the world, and a cornerstone of the cultural life of New York City.

Balanchine choreographed 425 works over the course of 60-plus years, and his musical choices ranged from Tschaikovsky (one of his favorite composers) to Stravinsky (his compatriot and friend) to Gershwin (who embodied the choreographer's love of America). Many of Balanchine's works are considered masterpieces and are performed by ballet companies all over the world.

#### MARCIA DALE WEARY, 1936-2019 Founder

Despite her passing, Ms. Weary remains celebrated by critics and peers alike as one of the nation's foremost instructors of classical ballet. She began her teaching career in Carlisle, PA., in 1955 after her own studies with Thalia Mara and Arthur Mahoney at the School of Ballet Repertory in New York City. Under her leadership, Central Pennsylvania Youth Ballet has produced thousands of exquisitely prepared, classically trained dancers, including current principal dancers Ashley Bouder, Lia and Jeffery Cirio, Leta Biasucci and Abi Stafford, to name just a few. Currently, more than 80 alumni occupy positions in highly regarded ballet companies such as New York City Ballet, American Ballet Theatre, San Francisco Ballet, Boston Ballet, Pacific Northwest Ballet, Miami City Ballet, and Pennsylvania Ballet.



Ms. Weary's unequaled dedication to her school, students and instructors, and her unique teaching style have positioned Central Pennsylvania Youth Ballet at the top of the dance field. Prior to her death, the New York Times wrote that Ms. Weary produces "...dancers well known in the ballet world..." and DanceTeacher magazine noted that she "...produces students who have the whole package —attention to detail, early technical development, and a broad socialization into the arts..." Ms. Weary and CPYB have been featured in leading newspapers and magazines, television news and features, and in the award-winning documentary presented on national public television entitled "Children with a Dream."

Ms. Weary was the recipient of many awards and distinctions over the past two decades, including the 1992 recipient of the Distinguished Service to the Arts Award for Central Pennsylvania; the 2000 Carlisle Regional Arts Award, of which she was the first recipient; the 2007 Pennsylvania Governor's Award for the Arts for Outstanding Leadership and Service to Youth; the 2009 Distinguished Citizen of the Commonwealth Award; the Central Penn Business Journal 2010 Woman of Influence Award for her leadership, integrity and accomplishments; an honorary doctor of performing arts degree from Dickinson College, in recognition of her contributions to the performing arts; the Messiah Village/Harrisburg Magazine 2012 SAGE Award; and most recently, the 2015 Leadership Cumberland Award, in recognition of her dedication to changing lives through dance.

She then returned to her hometown to assume the role as Principal of the Lower School at Kansas City Ballet School before completing her education then relocating to Carlisle to join the CPYB family and have the incredible experience of learning first-hand from Marcia Dale Weary.

As chief executive officer of Ballet San Jose, Hineline led all aspects of the organization's mission fulfillment - working closely with trustee and artistic leadership on strategic initiatives, board development, financial stewardship, institutional marketing and fundraising campaigns, and artistic programming. Hineline served as CEO for Central Pennsylvania Youth Ballet (CPYB) from 2009 to 2014. His strategies to expand the CPYB profile and develop financial support of the organization's mission put CPYB on a path toward long-term sustainability and viability for future generations of students and audience members. Previously, Hineline lead Ballet Philippines, in Manila, as chief operating officer and artistic director. In his role, he oversaw a complete rebranding of the organization including repertoire expansion, artistic development of the company artists, and a heightened institutional profile.
